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Copyright in Serbia

The law concerning author's rights is favorable to libraries:

it permits to give all kind of information and lend everything in their collections in any format except for commercial usage.



Copyright law in Serbia

♦ Article 44

Short excerpts from the disclosed works may be reproduced without the author's permission and without paying remuneration if used for non-commercial purposes in the field of education, examination or scientific research.



Copyright law in Serbia

♦ Article 45

Public libraries, educational institutions, museums and archives shall have the right to reproduce works without author's permission and without paying remuneration, exclusively for their archival and non-commercial purposes.



Education about Copyright

- ◆ An IL education of postgraduates in Belgrade, Novi Sad, Nis and Kragujevac Universities, in cooperation with the Ministry of Science, the Serbian National Library and University Library Belgrade.
- One of the course modules for the postgraduates is copyright protection.



Education of librarians

- Lectures organized in all kinds of libraries, designed in such manner that they include theoretical classes on copyright protection, and workshops.
- ◆ The objective of these workshops is to reach appropriate conclusions in this field through discussions, questions and answers.



Education of LIS students

- Curriculum for the third and fourth year and master course of LIS studies at the Faculty of Philology of Belgrade University LIS Department.
- ◆ In this manner librarians-to-be are getting acquainted with the grounds of copyright protection, before they commence their professional engagement.
