Research method

Main results



Research tells us that in a comprehensive approach to media and information literacy students learn about media and with media:

Learning *with* **media**, which means to be able to access, use, and communicate with (new) media and

learning *about* **media**, which means to be able to analyze and produce media and to understand information society.

Matrix of target dimensions and key skills



Learning with media

teaches children and adolescents how to access, use, and communicate with (new) media in productive ways

Learning to access and use information / media

- √ locate and access information
- √ process information
- evaluation and effective use of information

Learning to communicate with media

- √ use appropriate technology to communicate
- √ cooperate with (new) media
- √ develop presentation skills

Learning about media

helps children and adolescents to understand, analyse, and interpret the ideas and concepts they encounter

Learning to analyse media

- ✓ get to know the media landscape
- ✓ understand media messages
- evaluate media messages

Learning to produce media

- develop technical competencies
- ✓ use appropriate mediums
- create and publish media products

Learning to understand media society

- ✓ reflect one's own media consumption
- √ recognise media construction of reality
- develop skills of inquiry and self-expression
