



1. Definition

Gradation is a morphologically induced vowel alternation also called apophony (from Ancient Greek apophōné) or ablaut (a German term based on the term Umlaut, a somewhat similar phenomenon). In Proto-Indo-European (PIE), all roots included a single vowel that might undergo gradation; this was also true for most athematic derivational suffixes (= those that did not end in a thematic vowel), and also for some inflectional suffixes. Thus gradation could show up in both derivation and inflection. PIE had three ablaut grades, full grade (with e and e0), zero-grade (no ablaut vowel), and lengthened grade (with e and e0). Some scholars assume that a similar ablaut e1/2 existed as well (most notably Szemerényi 1990:91). It seems that at least in PIE gradation in a derivational suffix depended on gradation in the root and

inflectional suffix: a zero grade in a derivational suffix was not allowed if both the root and the inflectional suffix (= ending) were zero, and an e-grade in a derivational suffix was not allowed if either the root or the inflectional suffix was in the e-grade.

In general, gradation played an important role in PIE morphology and continued to do so in Ancient Greek, but to a lesser extent. Note that one has to distinguish between such morphologically induced ablaut grades and sequences that just look like ablaut grades on the surface but were actually changes induced by phonological processes. As Greek developed, such phonological processes sometimes changed old ablaut patterns, leading speakers to create new patterns or to level those that were inherited.






The war with Iran is the almost single preoccupation of the Saddam Husayn regime and is the principal determinant of Iraqi foreign and domestic policy Saddam is locked in a war of attrition, the duration of which depends on a regime in Tehran that espouses Saddam's overthrow as a religious duty. We do not expect the war to end soon. The Iranians—more importantly, Khomeini—have given little indication that they are willing to negotiate a settlement to the conflict.

We believe Saddam will remain in power for the two-year period of this Estimate, but in our judgment his regime has become more brittle It is more narrowly based on family and tribal ties and more dependent on fear as an instrument of control than it was when the war began

in ewiger Einsamkeit mit Gott allein zu leben« (franz. solitude éternelle avec Dieu seul [5]; Jansenismus). Der Puritanertheologe Richard Baxter konnte sich um die Mitte des 17. Jh.s das ewige Leben nur als Feier eines ewigen Gottesdienstes vorstellen. Werden die Seligen also Flügel bekommen und »rittlings auf einer Wolke sitzen und Halleluja Halleluja singen«? - so Sören Kierkegaard 1855 auf seinem Sterbebett. Dieses theozentrische H.-Bild sah sich in der Nz. mehreren Herausforderungen ausgesetzt.

2. Neuzeitliche Herausforderungen

Das Thema spiegelt sich auch in Goethes Roman *Die Leiden des jungen Werthers* (1774): Nach herkömmlicher Vorstellung darf es die Liebe zwischen dem unverheirateten jungen Werther und der unglücklich verheirateten Charlotte nicht geben. Eine Beschreibung des Paradieses der Liebenden liefert Novalis im *Lied der Toten* (1800): »Leiser Wünsche süßes Plaudern/ Hören wir allein, und schauen/ Immerdar in selge Augen, / Schmecken nichts als Mund und Kuss.«

3. Lokalisierung und Dynamisierung

Eine zweite Herausforderung bezog sich auf die Lokalisierung des H., wurde doch die ma. Verortung des H. jenseits eines das Weltall umspannenden Firmaments durch die nzl. astronomische Forschung unmöglich (vgl. Astronomie; Kosmos). Die Theologie verzichtete deshalb zumeist auf eine Lokalisierung, jedoch wurde auch die Meinung vertreten, der H. befinde sich innerhalb des geschaffenen Universums, vielleicht »unermesslich weit entfernt vom Sonnensystem«, so Jonathan Edwards im 18. Jh. [4]. Nach dem »vorkritischen« Immanuel Kant bleibt die Seele nach dem Tod des Leibes nicht an die Erde gebunden, sondern schwingt sich zu anderen Planeten auf, wo sie ihr ewiges Leben verbringen wird (*Allgemeine Naturgeschichte und Theorie des Himmels*, 1755).
