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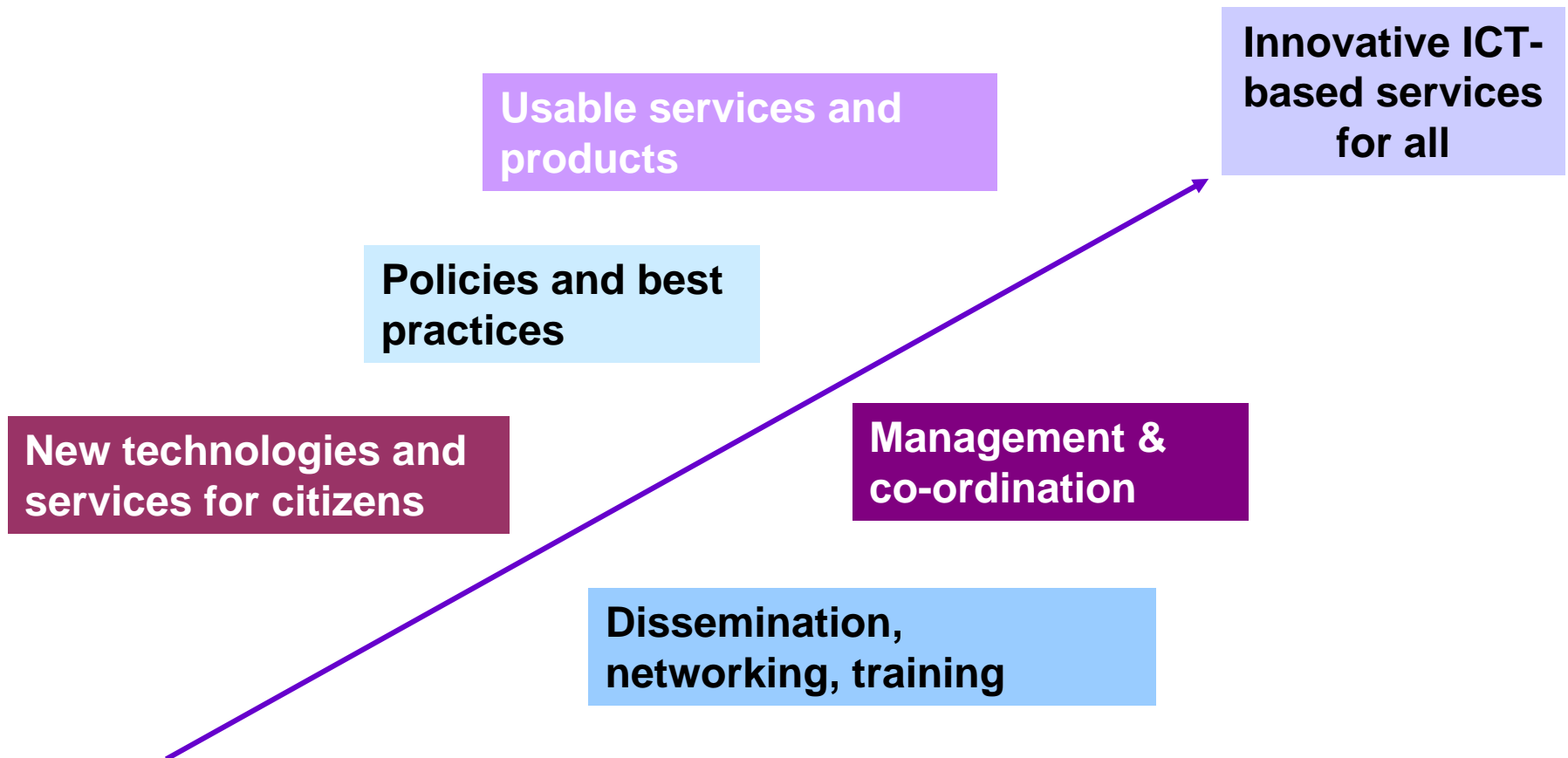

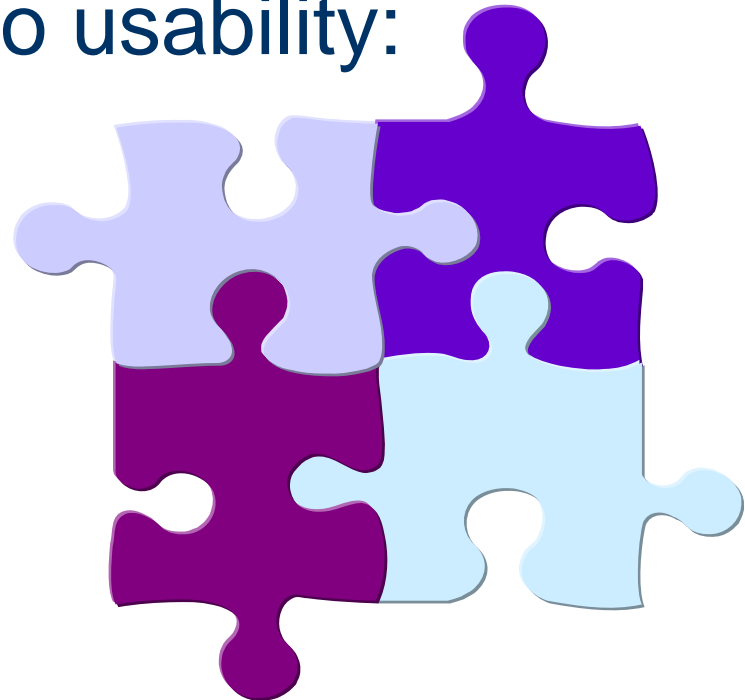


WP3: The end-user experience: a usable community memory

- Other view:
 - Universal usability

Usability standards and the context of local memory institutions

- Process-oriented approach: ISO 9241-11 (1998) etc.
- Product-oriented approach: ISO 9126 (1–4 parts, 2001 – 2004)
- Needs of the local memory institutions (Usability Forum, Hungary):
 - Usability guidance & consultancy
 - Usability education & information dissemination
 - Greater co-operation between archives, libraries and museums

Usability approach for memory institutions

- Generic usability model for memory institutions: what is the starting point?
- Phenomenon of “memory institutions”:
 - What is it?
 - What is common?
 - What is different?
- Memory institutions – social mission

Important usability areas for memory institutions

- Age-specific issues
- Cross-cultural usability
- Human abilities
- Socio-technological usability constraints
- Horizontal issue: usability of WWW services

Conclusions

- Usability-related information overload: standards and recommendations often are not usable themselves
- Common usability framework for memory institutions – further research is needed:
 - Perspectives & limitations
 - Areas for exchange of experience
- A usability “cookbook” – priorities and criteria
