- Gale Digital Archives now include over 250 Million pages, sourced from the world's most prestigious libraries and archives












1957-1959 Plague of Locusts



What is Text and Data Mining?

- "Automated processing of large amounts of structured digital textual content, for purposes of information retrieval, extraction, interpretation, and analysis."
 Bernie Reilly, President of the Center for Research Libraries
- To Gale, text and data mining represents a new opportunity to lead the way in making content highly useful for scholarly research and to add value to our historical archives
- Gale aim to facilitate faculty and library connections, take part in new research across the humanities and social science disciplines, and position the library as the centre of research.



Why is it Important to Researchers?

- An almost entirely new front for investigation and analysis
- Allows researchers to enrich content through improved indexing, perform a systematic review of literature, create new databases that themselves can be mined, and do research on mining itself for computational linguistics research

Increasingly, scholars want to do more than just search and view special collections. They want to analyse them in large numbers using computer programmes, to find undiscovered patterns, and to ask new questions





What is being provided, and how?

- Gale will deliver a hard drive with the XML from each of the resources that the library requests (and for which the corresponding archive purchase has been made)
- The XML will differ depending on the resource (platform, date created, material type, etc.).
- Any resource that is cross-searchable on *Gale Primary Sources* will have the same data structure.
- The XML content is the same as the OCR text viewable in the interface as well as accompanying metadata
- The library will be responsible for getting their students/faculty access to the content after Gale has delivered the drive.



How can the data be used, and by whom?

- The library will be responsible for managing access to the data
- The data can be used by any faculty, student, librarian, or scholar that would have access under the original license agreement signed
- The terms and conditions of use are covered in the licensing addendum
- The data can be used in myriad ways. It is all up to the researchers
- Researchers do not have to let Gale know when they are publishing research based on the data but we would love to know what work is being done!
