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




Perspectives on "the skills problem"

Maintaining the pool


- Incentivise

IASA Taskforce recommendations

- Collaborate w/ other associations
- Fund training activity
- Collate info on available trainers
- Consider certification scheme with other associations
- Consider fundraising as part of a training strategy
- Any IASA training resource be formally offered across whole membership





British Library: Unlocking Our Sound Heritage

- Five year project
- Target: digitally preserve 160,000 physical items
- 500,000 recordings
- Catalogue all for discovery
- Clear rights for 20% (100,000 recordings) online access
